Receive CARES Act Assistance Program Application Summary

The Board was presented with applications that MBK staff recommended for approval and denials. Staff reported that the CARES program is the largest program to date with a total of 450 applications and 2,284 field lots entered. The program was broken into six categories; (1) Full Reimbursement, (2) Partial Reimbursement, (3) Applications Submitted After 10/15/2021 (Late), (4) Withdrawn Applications (5) In-Eligible Districts, (6) Outside FOD & Exceptions.

Review Status of Bureau of Reclamation Grant Programs

The Board discussed in-depth and what to do with the extra \$5 million. Marc Staunton aske the Board what their thoughts were on for usage of the additional \$5 million that Reclamation has granted and proposed the potential use for domestic wells. He & Paul Simmons reached out to Klamath County Commissioner Morris and DeGroot and provided information for the request to the Governor's office which included Domestic Well mitigation funds. There is a meeting set for the 29th with the Governor's office. The Board will defer discussions of doing a well mitigation program until the state decides on the County's request.

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Discuss Long Term Agreement with Bureau of Reclamation

Mike Neuman stated that Reclamation wants a program with a five year-term instead of the short one term. They have funds obligated and would like to not be in the tradition of rushing contracts, and would like to reduce the anxiety this causes everyone. Mike Neuman went on to state that is it important for Reclamation to address short-term needs, but in the long-term to strengthen drought resiliency.
